## Purpose of Manual

This competition manual details the rules and minimum delivery requirements of the 2026 National State Championships (NSC) in Melbourne, Victoria.

### 1. Event Objectives

#### Players & Teams:

- To provide a platform to bring the best emerging players, coaches, and officials from around Australia together to compete in a national event.
- Deliver a competitive environment which enables high-quality performances.
- To bring the best players together and provide a strong platform for our High-Performance Coaching cohort to select players for the National Age Group Program (NAGP) squads following this competition.

#### Referees:

- Selected in consultation within their state body and identified as an emerging referee.
- Provided professional development throughout this event via Water Polo Australia through experienced delegates and advanced referees.

#### Coaches:

- Identified and appointed by their state and the potential to be provided an opportunity to coach National Age Group Programs (NAGP) and future junior National Teams.

### 3. Equipment

- **Pool Length** - L 20-25m, W 10-25m (as per World Aquatics rules).
- **Pool Depth** - Minimum 1.8m (preferably 2.2m)
- **Ball Size** - Matches will be conducted using KAP7 Balls.
- Girls Matches – Size 4
- Boys Matches – Size 5
  - o Game Balls will be supplied by Water Polo Australia.
  - o Warm-up/Training balls to be supplied by States/Teams
- **Goal Size** - All matches will be played with goals that are W 3.0m x H 0.9m (inside measurements).

## 5. Eligibility

- 5.1** All players, coaches, team officials, referees, match officials and other persons actively involved in the operation and playing in the NSC must be a current 2026/27 Season financial Member in the WPA Member Pool database, agreeing to abide and be bound by the constitution, rules, regulations, by-laws, and policies of WPA including the rules set out here.
- 5.2** The National State Championships is open to Platinum Junior Registered members for Season 2026/27. Players must be financial and in good standing with their Primary affiliated State Association for a minimum of 12 months and have been selected as part of their State Association Pathways/Academy programs. However, special exemptions may be provided by WPA on request of the State association.
- 5.3** All players must be born in the following years to be eligible in the following divisions:
- 15&U – 2011 & 2012
  - 17&U - 2009 & 2010
- Athletes are only permitted to participate in one (1) division of the 15&U and 17&U Age Groups.



## 6. Team Composition

- 6.1 A maximum of one team per gender, per division, from any State Association that is affiliated with Water Polo Australia (WPA).
- 6.2 WPA in conjunction with State Associations will consider the entry of any International or Barbarian Teams to compete as the nominated eighth team. If an International or Barbarian Team competes, they can progress to the medal rounds. If they win the NSC, the State who finishes highest in the final placings is declared the NSC Champions.
- 6.3 States are required to check that all nominated players meet the eligibility criteria.
- 6.4 The following rules will apply to team lists:

### 6.5 Teams/Squads

- Each team shall consist of 14 players; **12 field players and 2 goalkeepers.**
- If a team has less than 14 players, the State must enter the Draft Player System to select additional players to reach 14 in total.

### Team Staff

- Team Coaches must be a current Gold Member or above with Water Polo Australia for 2026/27 Season and all Team Managers must be a current Bronze Volunteer Member or above in 2026/27. All staff must be listed during the team entry process via the RevSport MemberPool.
- One (1) Head Coach and one (1) Team Manager per team are the minimum requirements for each team entry, however an additional Assistant Coach (meeting the membership requirements above for a coach) may be listed via the RevSport MemberPool.
- For the purposes of these Rules, any Head Coach, Assistant Coach or Team Manager entered on the Team List will be considered a "Team Official".
- A Manager may be allocated across multiple teams.

### Referees

- Referees will be managed by Water Polo Australia and selected in consultation with the State Association and who are of a suitable standard for this tournament.
- All referees are required to be a current 2026/27 Gold Member with Water Polo Australia.

### Cap Numbers

- All players must be allocated a cap number, with red cap numbers 1 & 13 dedicated for goalkeepers.



The State Association is responsible for ensuring that each Player and Team Official meets the minimum SIA (Sport Integrity Australia) requirements listed below by **Monday September 14, 2026**:

If SIA requirements are not met by **Monday September 14, 2026**, officials will not be granted access to pool deck at NSC Venues.

## 7. Draft

- The player draft system will be managed by WPA in consultation with State Associations.
- This is a new pilot initiative in 2026 which will be trialled as part of the upcoming cycle and reviewed after September's NSC Competition in Melbourne.
- The Player Draft System has been developed to maximise development opportunities for athletes within the National Age Group Program (NAGP) while strengthening the overall standard and competitiveness of the NSC competition.
- Following the completion of final NSC team selections, States will have the opportunity to nominate athletes who were unsuccessful in gaining selection to their respective state teams into a WPA-managed Draft Player Pool. These athletes will remain eligible for consideration by States and territories requiring additional players to complete rosters or provide positional depth.
- Water Polo Australia will work collaboratively with the receiving states and coaches to allocate draft athletes based on team requirements, positional needs, athlete development opportunities, and the overall competitive integrity of the competition.



## How the Draft System Works

### State Team Selections Finalised

- All States complete their NSC team selections by 31 July 2026

### States Nominate Draft Athletes

- Unsuccessful but *pathway-aligned* athletes are nominated to the **Draft Player Pool**.
- Athletes must be **ranked by position**.
- States must confirm they are **capable of competing at NSC level** and will contribute positively to the competition environment.

### States Request Support (by 31 July 2026) States that:

- Cannot fill a full roster, or
- Need **additional positional depth**, submit a request to WPA for draft player support.

### WPA Allocation Process

WPA works with State associations and coaches to match athletes to teams based on:

- Positional needs
- Team depth
- Athlete readiness
- Maintaining competition integrity
- **Draft completion date will be no later than Friday 7 August 2026**

## 7. Conduct of Matches

The competition will be conducted in accordance with current World Aquatics rules or as modified at the discretion of Water Polo Australia.

- The first named team must wear white/light caps and start from the end of the pool, which is to the left when facing the pool from the officials table.
- The second named team will wear a cap of contrasting colour, predominantly dark.
- If in the opinion of the referees, there is a clash of caps, the first named team has the choice.
- All team members must wear the same swimmer/uniform at all games except for composite teams and possible draft players who wear their club or state swimmer/uniform.
- Coaches and team officials who occupy the bench during games must be dressed in the same team uniform including enclosed shoes. There may be a maximum of 3 officials and 7 players on the bench during any match.
- A minimum of 10 minutes shall be scheduled between games in the case of delay during the previous match to allow for warm up.
- Managers will be allowed to approach the delegate at the end of each quarter to cross check the score card.

### 7.1 Table Duty

Teams must provide a minimum of four (4) names of qualified table officials with their team lists through the Member Pool. One to two (1-2) listed table officials from both teams are



required for duty during the team's scheduled match (including playoffs, semi-finals and finals). Failure to provide table officials may result in a monetary fine as a sanction.

States requiring assistance will be invoiced separately at a rate of \$30 per game per person. WPA has set up an EOI registration link for Table Officials to register their availability during the tournament. [2026 NSC - Table Official - Water Polo Australia - revolutioniseSPORT](#)

**If Water Polo Australia has independent table officials available for the semi-finals and finals, teams will be advised accordingly.**

The roles that must be filled from both teams are:

1. Timekeeper - Clock/Shot Clock
2. Scorecard
3. Flags/Caller and Exclusion Card
4. Live Scoring

## 7.2 Competition Structure

- All teams will play each other in a round robin format.
- Once all teams have played each other, the teams will play Semi Finals and then Finals.

Semi Final 1 = 1 v 4, Semi Final 2 = 2 v 3

## 7.3 Match Times

- 4 quarters of 7-minute actual time with 1-minute break between periods and 2-minute break at half time.
- Shot Clock – 28 seconds 1<sup>st</sup> possession – 18 seconds 2<sup>nd</sup> possession

### 7.3.1 Time Outs

- There are no Timeouts during round games (Rounds 1 to 7)
- Each team may request two (2) time outs per game for Semi Finals and Finals only, that can be used at any time as per World Aquatics rules.
- Timeouts are not applicable for 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> playoffs.

### 7.3.2 Penalty Shootouts

- As per World Aquatics, all games must be played to a result.
- Water Polo Australia will be following the Penalty Shoot Out rules set out by World Aquatics. These rules can be found – [here](#).
- The shooting order will be recorded by the Table Official on the scorecard and the delegate on their Statistics Sheet.
- Once the first (1<sup>st</sup>) round of the PSO is complete, the responsibility for ensuring that players shoot in the same order from the first (1<sup>st</sup>) round will be of the coach and/or team manager of each team.



- Any errors in the shooting order from the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) round onwards, will be deemed to have been a result of an error made by the team whose players proceeded in contravention of the shooting order and is not a matter that can be protested.
- Game Officials will follow World Aquatics rules regarding a PSO. Note: VAR is not used.

## 7.4 Points System

- Win in regular time— 3 points
- Win after penalty shootout = 2 points
- Loss after penalty shootout = 1 point
- Loss in regular time – 0 point
- Disqualification/Forfeit – 0 points (0-5 goal score)

### 7.4.1 Tie Break

All matches shall be played in accordance with the World Aquatics' current Competition Rules, or similar. Variations on a technical level are possible.

Each game must have a winner. If a game ends with a tie in regular time, the teams must go into a penalty shoot-out according to the Rules.

The matches shall be scored as follows:

- a) win in regular time = 3 points
- b) win after penalty shootout = 2 points
- c) loss after penalty shootout = 1 point
- d) loss in regular = 0 point

Teams' rankings are obtained by adding up the number of points won.

#### 20.9.1.11.1.1 Tie Breaking Rules, Group phase or Round Robin Tournaments

20.9.1.11.1.1.1 If two (2) teams finish the Group phase or Round Robin on equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:

The team winning the game between them (including penalty shoot-out if any) shall be placed higher.

If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.

In Water Polo Australia competitions where draws are allowed in the Group phase or Round Robin Tournaments, if two (2) teams are tied on points and the game between the two teams was a draw, the tie will be decided by using 20.9.1.11.1.1.2 from point 4 below.

20.9.1.11.1.1.2 If three (3) or more teams finish the Group phase or Round Robin on equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:



The results of games played only between the tied teams shall determine which team is placed highest. That is, games that the tied teams have played against teams not involved in the tie, are NOT considered for the goal difference.

The comparison shall be made:

1. First, upon the points of the games played only between those tied teams.
2. Second, the goal difference (excluding the goals from penalty shoot-out) in games played only between the teams that are tied. The teams that have the greatest difference between goals scored and goals conceded shall be placed higher.
3. Third, based upon total goals scored in games only between the teams that are tied. The teams scoring the most goals shall be placed higher.
4. If still tied, the games played against the highest placed team (or teams, if tied, the team or teams not involved in the tie) shall be considered.
  - a. The first comparison shall be based on goal difference (as in point 2.), and if still tied, then based on goals scored (as in point 3).
  - b. If still tied, the results against the next highest placed team (or teams, if tied) shall be used in succession until all results have been considered.
  - c. If still tied, and there is no practical manner to determine the ranking, the final classification between the teams in the tie shall be decided by coin-toss.
5. If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.
6. For the purpose of calculating either goal difference or goals scored, the goals in any penalty shoot-out will not be taken into consideration.

## 7.5 Awards Schedule

### Tournament Awards Process

- The following individual awards will be given at the tournament in each age division and gender:
  - Most Valuable Player
  - Most Valuable Goalkeeper
  - National Champion Team
- The relevant National Squad Selection Panel for each age group will determine the Most Valuable Player and Most Valuable Goalkeeper from across the entire competition.

## 7.6 Errors and Conduct of Game Officials

- For the purposes of these Rules, any Referee or Delegate will be considered a "Game Official".
- One Team Official will be provided with the WPA approved statistics sheet (see helpful links below for printing) to keep track of in-match statistics and for the purposes of any issues they may wish to raise during the match. If the Team Manager is not available than any other Team Official may use the sheet, however use of the sheet must be limited to one person for the duration of the match for the sheet to be considered reliable. This person is the 'nominated team official'.



- Decisions of Game Officials are final and cannot be appealed. Reasons are not required to be given for such decisions and any form of harassment of Game Officials during or after the game may result in disciplinary action.
- Technical Errors may be raised with the Delegate by the Nominated Team Official during one of the scheduled breaks in play (quarter-time, half-time and three-quarter time) and for 5 minutes after conclusion of the match (the conclusion of any PSO will be deemed the conclusion of the match if a PSO is necessary). Only one Nominated Team Official from each team may approach the Delegate. Breach of this provision may result in a red card.
- The Technical Errors which may be raised with the Delegate are limited to Exclusions and Scoring Errors.
- The Delegate will consider and rule on any Technical Errors at the time they are raised as per above and will immediately rectify, as deemed appropriate, without applying a replay. Such decisions are made in their sole and absolute discretion. The delegate is not required to give reasons for their decision, and their decision is binding and cannot be appealed.

## 7.7 Conclusion of the Match

The delegate of the match will check and sign the card to confirm its accuracy within 10 minutes of the match concluding. The delegate will confirm that the result of the match is correct and final.

Following this, the pool controller will send the scorecard results through to a Water Polo Australia representative to verify.

## 8. Disciplinary Matters

- 8.1** Disciplinary Matters will proceed in accordance with the procedures set out in the Water Polo Australia National Sanctioning Policy.
- 8.2** A daily hearing schedule will be provided prior to the tournament start date. All hearings will be held via teleconference to manage complaints or offences that need to be heard from previous days of play. If there are no complaints or offences that need to be heard from previous days the Disciplinary Tribunal will not convene a daily hearing on the relevant day.
- 8.3** The Disciplinary Tribunal's decision is final, binding upon all parties and can only be appealed in accordance with the Water Polo Australia National Sanctioning Policy.
- 8.4 Video**
  - If an Internal Tribunal Hearing is being convened, the Competition Manager/Officials Manager (or their Nominee) will identify and secure any video footage available of the Incident and make this available to the Internal Tribunal if required.
  - Official footage taken by the Organization of the Match can be provided to the Internal Tribunal if available.
  - All Submissions of Video footage must be by an authorised representative and registered for a photography pass before the start of the tournament. These submissions are subject to include a declaration that the footage hasn't been edited in any capacity.



- The Internal Tribunal at their discretion can choose to view video footage or not.

## 9. Forced Delay or Cancellation of Matches

9.1 Should circumstances occur which prevent play in some, or all matches in any round, Water Polo Australia shall assess the situation and decide on delaying or cancelling matches affected.

Should circumstances occur which prevent play in some or all matches in any round, the GM Play shall assess the situation and decide on delaying or cancelling matches affected.

9.2 The GM Play or their designated representative will determine if the match may proceed or if the match must be delayed or cancelled

9.3 If, due to unforeseen or exceptional circumstances a match is cancelled before the commencement or start of play and match cannot be rescheduled:

9.3.1 If during round games the match will be classified as a draw with 2 points awarded to each team with scored being noted as 5 – 5

9.3.2 If during finals games the winner of the match will be determined by a coin toss

9.4 If, due to unforeseen or exceptional circumstances a match is cancelled after commencement or the start is delayed the following regulations shall apply:

9.4.1 If two full quarters have been completed by the originally scheduled completion time and the margin is 6 goals or greater, the team in the lead will be awarded the win.

9.4.2 If the two full quarters have not been completed by the originally scheduled completion time and the margin is 5 goals or less, a draw will be recorded.

9.4.3 If the match has entered the third quarter at the originally scheduled completion time and the goal margin is 4 or greater, the team in the lead will be awarded the win.

9.4.4 If the match has entered the third quarter at the originally scheduled completion time and the goal margin was 3 or less, a draw will be recorded.

9.4.5 If the match has entered the fourth quarter at the originally scheduled completion time and the goal margin is 2 or greater, the team in the lead will be awarded the win.

9.4.6 If the match has entered the fourth quarter at the originally scheduled completion time and the goal margin is 1 or less, a draw will be recorded.

9.5 The Pool Controller will liaise with the GM Play or the National Competitions Coordinator and Venue Staff and notify teams once a decision has been reached if matches are delayed or cancelled if storms/lightning are present.

- Please note the following protocols which are required to be adhered to in the case of inclement weather during competition. Where a venue has their own Lightning Protocol, the venue's protocol takes precedence:

### 9.6 Lightning Protocol

9.6.1 WPA will follow all lighting protocols of the venue.

9.6.2 If there is no lightning protocol in place at the venue, the following steps will occur:

- Play must stop immediately if the time between seeing a lightning flash and hearing thunder is 30 seconds or less.



- Referees must signal the players to exit the pool immediately and seek safety under appropriate shelter.
- Game play must not resume until a minimum of 30 minutes has passed since the last lightning flash. If a flash occurs within the 30 minutes, the evacuation clock starts again.
- Venue Staff will determine when play must be stopped and when it can resume. In the instance where no venue staff are present, the Pool Controller will stop play and notify the GM Play as soon as possible.

## 10. Breaching Competition Rules

- 10.1** Any team that is found to be in breach of any of the competition rules, during the competition, at the discretion of Water Polo Australia, may be sanctioned or disqualified.
- 10.2** If a matter arises which is not explicitly dealt with under these rules, but which in the reasonably held view of Water Polo Australia is a breach of World Aquatics Rules/Water Polo Australia modified competition rules, and not in the spirit of the game or results in clear unfairness to one team if not remedied, Water Polo Australia will have sole and absolute discretion to rectify the matter using any remedies and penalties such as it sees fit. The relevant remedies and penalties can include but are not necessarily limited to fines, exclusions, warnings or disqualification.
- 10.3** Any decision made by Water Polo Australia under this section is final, binding upon all parties and cannot be appealed.

## 11. Photography

Photographers or Videographers (including using mobile phones on a stand) with SLR Cameras must complete their details, including evidence of their Working with Children Check through the online form (see below in "Helpful links") prior to their attendance at a venue.

On the first day of the competition the Photographer is to have their name marked off the Photography Register and collect their Photography pass from WPA Staff.

They must show their WWCC/Driver's License to a WPA staff member to sight and approve. The photography pass must always be visible when taking photos.

Those with photography passes can take photos with their SLR Cameras from the designated photography areas being the Grandstand seating area only. No Pool Deck access is permitted.

Professional Photographers or accredited Media Personnel will be wearing an identifiable Photographers Bib. Due to OH&S concerns these are the only personnel allowed to photograph on Pool Deck.

WPA Staff and Event Officials have the authority to escort any persons that do not follow these rules off pool deck and remove any Event Entry Passes and/or photography tags.



## 12. Code of Conduct – Parents, Players, Coaches, Managers & Spectators

Water Polo Australia and its Member Organisations remain fully committed to the protection of all members, parents and spectators who attend our events and competitions. Please refer to the [WPA Code of Conduct](#).

**Anyone** who breaches our Policies and procedures whilst in attendance of any events or competition will be sanctioned as per the [WPA National sanctioning policy](#).

We aim to ensure that water polo is a safe, fair and inclusive environment for all.

## 13. Concussion Guidelines
